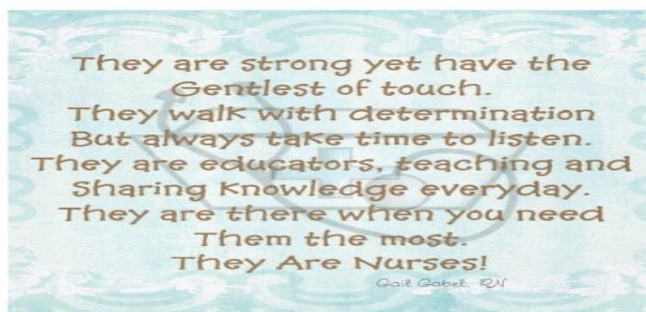

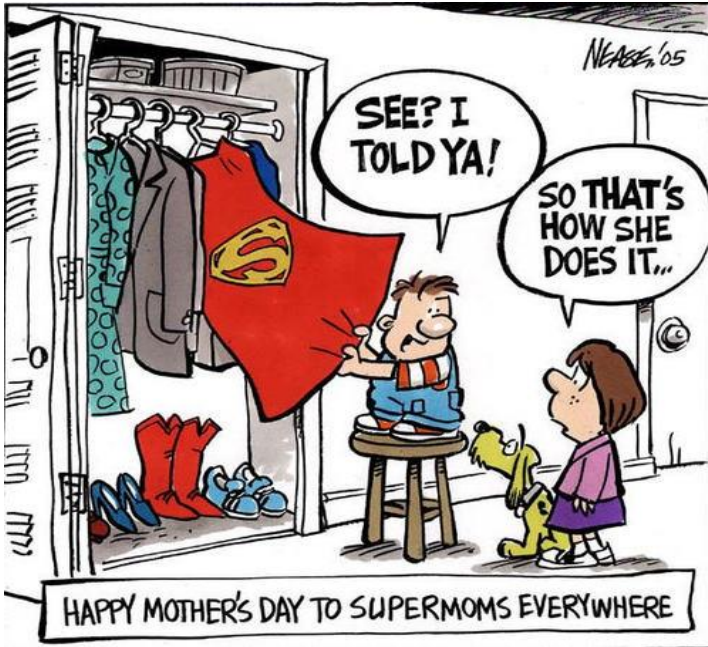

Resident Rights

In Ontario, long term care homes must follow a law called the Long Term Care Homes Act. It includes a Residents' Bill of Rights.

Resident Right #1- "Every resident has the right to be treated with courtesy and respect and in a way that fully recognizes the resident's individuality and respects the resident's dignity."

Resident Right #2- "Every resident has the right to be protected from abuse."

Resident Right #3- "Every resident has the right not to be neglected by the licensee or staff."

Automated Income Verification

Re: Rate Reduction Application-
Basic Accomodation (only)

The Ministry of Health and Long Term Care(MOHLTC) has an agreement with the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) that provides for Automated Income Verification (AIV) that is used by MOHLTC in the administration of income-related assistance programs. Using the AIV, the MOHLTC is able to obtain an individual's income information from the CRA in order to assess a resident's Application. Applications assessed using the AIV are processed more quickly and more efficiently than paper-based applications.

What does this mean? You no longer need to provide us with a copy of the Notice of Assessment for the recent tax year in order to apply for a rate reduction. Leacock will mail the AIV consent form to you. Please complete and send back to us at your earliest convenience. If you do not wish to consent to the assessment of your application using AIV, this will not affect your eligibility. MOHLTC will assess your application using your paper Notice of Assessment. Thank you.

- New Ministry of Health Rate Letter
- Accommodation Agreement
- Unfunded Services Agreement
- Admission Record (documenting the services that have been signed for last year)
