Leaving The Building

Early last week Ontario's Chief Medical Officer released a directive stating that residents of retirement communities are not permitted to leave the home for short visits (including visiting family). At this time residents can still leave the building to walk about the property (while practicing safe social distancing), but it is highly discouraged to do so. We also have a tuck shop located in the Recreation Office on the main floor, which carries a selection of items for your convenience.



Tray Service

In recent discussion with Public Health and Jarlette Health Services, we are going to be going to tray service for all residents this week. We are simply not able to provide enough social distancing (6 feet) in our dining room. Residents are <u>not</u> confined to your rooms, we are not in isolation, and we currently do not have COVID-19 at Roberta Place. These are just precautionary measures in order to keep people apart from one another.

Orders for tray service will be taken 3-4 days at a time. You will receive a call from us to have this order taken. We will start by serving the 1st Floor, and making our way up floor by floor. Breakfast should arrive between 8-9AM; Lunch should arrive between 11:30-1:30PM; Dinner should arrive between 4:30-6:30PM. Please utilize the bistro for any snack needs.







Social Distancing & Gathering Limitations

The Government of Canada has recommended that citizens practice safe social distancing. This means we keep approximately 6 ft of space between one another, not touch one another, or share items. Please do your best to keep that distance, both for your safety and others. Please continue to regularly wash your hands, avoid touching your face, and sneeze/cough into your elbow, rather than your hands.

This past weekend, the Government of Ontario has stated that we must not have gatherings larger than 5 people. We will see changes to our common spaces, and activities:

Common Spaces

To keep us all safe, we have moved furniture around in the lodge's common spaces, to ensure we are keeping one another at a distance. Seating has been placed approximately 6ft away from one another. Please try to sit in the seating provided. We will be discouraging residents from moving chairs, or sitting on walkers, to ensure everyone is keeping 6ft apart. We will be expanding our sitting areas to the dining room, and creating lounge space in this area during this time.

Activities

Many of our regular activities have had to be cancelled for the time being. This includes any games which require close contact, sharing of items, or have gatherings of larger than 4-5 people (depending if there is a staff member running the activity). This means our evening programs are cancelled for the time being, due to these being gatherings of larger than 5 people. Unfortunately we may have to turn away residents if we reach our limit, but highly encourage you to come out. I will strive to create fun programs that we can enjoy from a distance at this time. If the activity is on the calendar it is still happening.





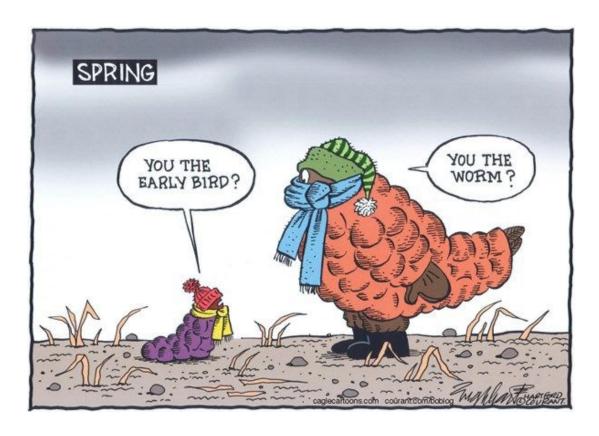
Recreation Department

Family members are not allowed into the building during this time, and so we've had to get creative. We have designated a room on our main floor for these visits. We have set up a cozy spot for residents inside the lodge, and a cozy spot for family members to sit outside the lodge. Using walkie talkies, you will be able to visit and talk with your family through the window.

Our second way to visit is through Video Calls. Roberta Place has a tablet designated to video calls for residents and their family members. Ellen will assist with getting you connected.

Both visits and calls must be arranged with Ellen in advance. We ask that those residents who are on the first floor book visits through Ellen as well. Please see Ellen in the Recreation Office on the Main Floor for details.
